#### \*\*Important Update for Parents & Volunteers\*\*

#### Palliser School Division: Covid-19 Vaccine Status

#### Disclosure and Testing Requirements -Non-Employees (Volunteers & Practicum Students)



As of January 4, 2022 any volunteer for a Division activity who will have direct contact with employees and/or Division students must be fully vaccinated. If not fully vaccinated, the Volunteer must provide proof of a negative COVID-19 rapid antigen screening test or PCR test completed no more than 72 hours prior to the time the Volunteer will have contact, in their volunteer capacity, with employee and/or Division student. Proof of full vaccination or in the alternative a negative COVID-19 test, will be required/permitted in the same form and pursuant to the same rules as applicable to employees of the Division outlined in procedures 1 and 2 above.

#### Family School Liaison Counselling Program

Surviving the Cut: Staying active when your teen doesn't make the school team.

Tryouts for school teams are common in junior and senior high, so is the reality of getting cut from one or more of these teams. Not making the team can be a tough experience for teens emotionally, socially and physically, but it doesn't mean an end to their involvement in sports. There are many opportunities for teens to be active outside school sports. Encourage them to look into community recreation programs in order to develop and practice their skills. Community sport can be a great way for your teen to meet new people, have fun and enjoy being active in a less competitive environment.

If competition is what your teen is after, some community leagues may have structured divisions based on recreational or competitive play, which allows a teen to choose a level based on their needs and wants. You could consider sports development camps in order to further grow your teen's skills and abilities.

When looking into programs, some things to consider are: the ratio of training to playing; how playing time is determined; the presence of the coach; and the emphasis on skill development or competition.

Being supportive of your teen is important for building and maintaining self-esteem and character. If your child gets cut from a school team, talk to them about what their goals are and provide them with options for how they can remain active, develop their skills, and have a positive experience with sport.

#### Grade 5 POD

**Language Arts**: We've wrapped up our unit on Complete Sentences, and students demonstrated their learning through our "My Amazing Life" writing assignment. We will be moving on to the study of the novel *Mick Harte was Here* by Barbara Park.



**Social:** We are completing our Mapping skills unit, including longitude, latitude and scale and are beginning our adventure of touring across Canada, starting with the Atlantic region.

**Science:** We are just finishing Wetlands and will be starting our Weather unit. We will look at different types of weather events and how they are created, air movement, how to measure different weather components like rain and wind, how to record weather, how weather impacts life and how we affect weather.

**Math:** We have wrapped up our introductory unit of Numeration and will be studying Multiplication. We will look at strategies for mental math multiplication, multiplication arrays and 2 digit by 2 digit multiplication. I encourage students to work on memorizing their times table.

#### Grade 6 POD

**Language Arts -** We have been continuing our work on short stories and narrative writing. We are looking more specifically at some short stories to apply the knowledge we have learned. This will help students put terms and knowledge into practice, as well as focus on reading comprehension skills. This also exposes students to effective narrative writing, which students will start practicing in late Nov/early Dec.

**Social -** We have studied the basics of democracy and examined the election system. We will be reviewing our different rights and freedoms, and will discuss the most effective ways to come to a decision. In November, we will be taking an in-depth look at the different levels of government, beginning with the municipal government.

**Science** - We are coming to the end of our Trees and Forests unit. Students have been working hard on their final projects and assignments and will write their unit test in mid November. Please watch your email for a copy of the study guide for the unit test.

**Math** - As we start November, we will be continuing with our unit on Number Relationships. Once this unit is complete, we will begin our next unit that looks more in depth at decimals & decimal operations. Please check with your child to make sure he/she has a calculator at school. A basic calculator is all that is required for Grade 6 Math. Please remember to check your child's Google Classroom if they are away, and Powerschool for all grades.

#### Grade 7 POD

**Language Arts** - We are in the middle of writing our narrative fiction stories. We started the writing process in October and have been trying out different strategies and types of fiction to inspire ideas. Students will pick their best/favorite story idea and turn it into a final draft by the middle of November. Then we will move on to our first core text *The Giver* by Lois Lowry. Once we have finished the book in December we will watch the film adaptation and compare the stories.



Social - We have been learning about the French

explorers and colonizers of the new world; such as Cartier, duMonts, Champlain, Radisson, Groseilliers, and Brule. Also, we have been learning about the origins of the fur trade and the creation of the HBC (Hudson Bay Company). Next up is the government, religion, and economics of New France.

**Science** - Once the Interactions & Ecosystems unit test has been completed, students will be starting to explore the Plants for Food and Fibre unit. We will be taking a closer look at the different parts of plants as well as their uses and environment. There will be a flower dissection lab as well for some hands-on learning!

**Math** - As we start November, we will be completing our current unit on Fractions, Decimals and Percent, and then moving on to our next unit about Fraction Operations. In this unit, we will explore adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers with like and unlike denominators. Some students are coming to class without calculators, so please ensure that your child has a calculator here at school.



#### Grade 8 POD

Language Arts: We have been wrapping up our "Mystery, Mayhem, and Suspense Unit" and moving on to our "Worth 1000 Picture Book Unit". This unit is all about the powerful message a picture book can send using only a few words and a handful of pictures. The end result will be the students' own original book. We are also continuing on with our daily routines of silent reading, writing



prompts, short films, online portfolios, grammar work, and reporting our reviews on Litsy.

**Social**: Our Italian City-State Simulation has come to a close and I feel as though the students have really gained some first hand experience of what it would have been like in the Renaissance. They learned that war was not the best way to make money, but trading and art was very lucrative. We will be moving into our study of humanism next. In this unit we will be studying Renaissance art and the changes it brought to society.

**Science:** Students will wrap up the Body Systems unit and start on Light & Optical Systems. In learning about light, students investigate its interactions with different materials and interpret its behavior using a geometric ray model. Students then use their understanding of light to interpret a variety of light-based technologies and contemplate new technologies we may use in the future. We will be dissecting a cow eyeball together which is a really fun demonstration for students.

**Math:** This month, we will be finishing up Chapter 2: Percent, Ratio & Rate. Students will demonstrate an understanding of ratio and rate. Students will solve problems that involve rates, ratios and proportional reasoning. Finally, students will work with percentages (greater to and less than 100%). Then, we will head into Chapter 3: Integers. This year, students will learn to both multiply and divide integers. We will review addition and subtraction of integers and eventually solve multiple operation problems involving integers (Order of Operations = BEDMAS). This will take us into the month of December.
