Back to School Reminders!

Welcome to Edsby! -

The Palliser School Division has moved to a different Student Information System called Edsembli this year, therefore PowerSchool is no longer being used.

The "New" Parent Portal program is called: Edsby and will be the method used to report GRADES and ATTENDANCE to parents.




Invitations for Edsby have been mailed. Please check your inboxes for a message from Palliser School Division (Junk mail or Spam mailboxes might need to be checked as well) If you don't see the invitation, please contact the office and we can resend it. If prompted when signing up, the School Code is Pallisersd

Edsby is the new/only online option for reporting your students' attendance. Please call our office at 403-345-3340 or email megan.curtis@pallisersd.ab.ca if you are having difficulties setting up your account.

**TIP: : Downloading the Edsby App and allowing notifications from Edsby helps us notify you quickly if your child is absent!

Please review the next couple of pages for some tips on navigating the attendance functions of Edsby as well as how to set up your parent account so that you receive Notifications for each of your students.




We would like to share a few **EDSBY** tid-bits of information that we have learned that may be helpful to parents.

Edsby invitations have been issued to all parents that we have an email address in our system for. If you did not receive one, please contact our office so we can resend the invitation and/or investigate why you did not get it.


Entering Absences in Edsby:

When entering an absence through Edsby, you have 2 options. If you select "Absent Today" your options are to choose the absent reason, and enter a comment (optional). The absent times will be automatically set to "Beginning of Day" to "End of Day."


If you select "Plan an Absence" you get also get the option to select a date (or range of days) as well as specific times, or periods. You may select the current date – it does not need to be a date in the future. You may select a time from the drop-down list or type in a specific time.



We have come across an issue in Edsby, where notifications are set up differently for students with siblings. If you have more than one student in Palliser schools this may be affecting you. Here is how to change the notification settings in Edsby, if you are not getting notifications (attendance, grades, etc.) for all of your students. In this example, Sibling 1 is the older sibling and they were added to Edsby first.:





 From the main screen, open the menu on the top left of the screen.





 In the Notifications window, you can see which notifications are set up for each school, as well as each student.

Being Mentally Healthy Why It's Important for You and Your Teen

The terms mental health and mental illness are often used to mean the same thing, but in reality, they are different. Everyone has mental health; not everyone has a mental illness like depression. Having good mental health helps us manage our emotions, care about others and cope with problems. It's important for teens and adults alike. The importance of learning the social and emotional skills that help keep us mentally healthy are sometimes overlooked at school because of the emphasis on academic success. However, research shows a strong link between having social and emotional skills, being resilient and having school success. Teens who have developed social and emotional skills find it easier to manage themselves, relate to others, resolve conflict, do better in school and feel positive about themselves and the world around them. Family life is our first "classroom" for social and emotional learning.

As a parent, you can be a strong positive influence on your teen's social and emotional growth and you can reflect and build on your own skills, helping you and your child in the process. Here are 5 areas you and your teen can learn more about and work to improve. Self awareness: Know your emotions and recognize their impact on your behaviour. Self-management: Know how to control your emotions and behaviours in challenging times and how to set and work towards goals. Social awareness: Understand, respect and have empathy for all people and their perspectives. Relationship skills: Know how to establish healthy relationships with others by communicating clearly, listening, cooperating, managing conflict, resisting peer pressure and seeking and offering help. Responsible decision making: Understand how your choices impact you and others.

Grade 5 POD

Language Arts: We're finishing up our examination of reading strategies using *The Bad Beginning* and will be moving on to Poetry!

Social: We will be working our way through the Atlantic Region of Canada. We will research the landscape, resources, climate, and history of the region and discuss how these geographical features affect the people that live there.



Science: We are studying Electricity and Magnetism. In this unit students will look at electrical safety, how to make circuits and the components needed, how electricity and magnetism work and uses for both.

Math: We will continue to look at strategies for mental math multiplication, multiplication arrays and 2 digit by 2 digit multiplication. I encourage students to work on memorizing their times table. You can use flashcards or google multiplication flashcards online and practice that way as well. 5 minutes a night will go a long way to help with all math.



Grade 6 POD

Language Arts: This month, we are continuing to work on our reading and comprehension of short stories. We will be starting to dive into paragraph writing closer to the end of the month. Students are reminded to come to class with their independent reading books for every LA class.



Social: We have finished learning about what democracy looks like in practice, and have begun to learn about the government at the local level. We will be learning about how decisions are made at this level, and why. Students will be completing a social city project, applying their learning to a fictional city of their making.

Science: We have started the Sky Science unit in science class. We will be studying objects that emit and reflect light in space, characteristics of different stars and planets, and what constellations are and how they move in our sky. This is a great time to get outdoors with your child and take a look at the night sky since it is dark early! We had a lunar eclipse in November and will be posting other celestial events on Google Classroom regularly.

Math: We are working on our Decimals Unit in the month of December. We are adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals, as well as solving problems related to decimals; such as money math. As well as decimal operations, we'll be integrating decimals into our previously learned place value knowledge. Practice those math facts nightly and check Google Classroom for review or if a student is absent!

Grade 7 POD



Language Arts: We are just finishing up our superhero narrative writing unit. Students are working hard to create their final projects. From here we will be moving into our first novel study using the core text *The Giver*, by Lois Lowry to explore the elements of dystopian fiction and to answer the inquiry questions of how this novel reflects our modern world and if safety is more important than freedom. We will read the novel in class and do various learning activities to explore these questions. At the end of the unit we will watch the film adaptation of The Giver (2014) and compare the two texts and analyze the changes made. We will learn and practice argumentative writing throughout the unit and end with a mock trial of one of the story's characters. This unit will flow into January.

Social: We are currently finishing up our learning about the early European settlers in North America. We will then be moving into the Fur Trade where we will be looking at the timeline and economic competition that was spurred on by rival fur trade companies. This will lead us into our next unit on war and the British conquest of North America. All materials and assignments will be made available to you on Google Classroom as we cover them in class.

Science: We are right on track with our Plants for Food and Fibre unit learning all about the different parts of plants and their functions. This is a short unit, so we will be having our unit test early December. After that we will spend some time reviewing the past two units, and then complete our midterm before the holiday break! Mrs. Smart will be back in January!

Math: In December, we will complete our Fraction Operations unit, where students are adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers with like and unlike denominators. If time permits, we may get a start on our Integers unit before Christmas break. In this unit, students will explore adding and subtracting integers. Students are reminded that they should be bringing their scientific calculators and a pencil to class every day.



The Kinette Club of Coaldale (graciously supported by the Coaldale Kinsmen) will be hosting a Christmas shopping event for kids up to Grade 9 on December 9th, 2022 from 2-6 pm at the Coaldale Community Centre.

Children will be able to shop for their parent/caregiver with the help of a Coaldale Kinette or volunteer (no parents allowed!). Kids will be sent home with to their chosen gift to surprise their parents/caregivers with at Christmas.

Grade 8 POD



Language Arts: We have just finished our Mystery, Mayhem, and Suspense unit where we focused on foreshadow, character development, and paraphrasing. We then began our Picture Book unit where the students are learning the skills of developing rich ideas in limited space and through multiple mediums. We have continued to work on grammatical writing skills, as well as adding specific detail to our writing. Feel free to check in with your child as to what they are currently reading-- if they aren't reading a book they enjoy, let me know and we can work on finding a good fit together.

Social: Students have explored the ideas of and used their historical perspective to imagine life in the European Renaissance. They are going into the last section of the Renaissance unit this month. They will explore sources, perspectives, and motivations during the Age of Exploration. This will also be Ms. Maguire's last month at R. I. Baker. Mr. Smith will take back over teaching Social Studies in January.

Science: In science students will continue to work through our Fresh and Salt Water Systems unit. We are working through the unit and students and parents can find all notes and videos on google classroom to stay up to date with the class.

Math: We will be spending the majority of December completing Chapter 3: Integer Operations. This includes a review of addition and subtraction of integers (completed in Math 7). Then, we will introduce multiplication of integers, followed by division of integers. Then, we will look to solve order of operation problems involving integers. Lastly, as with every chapter, there will be a problem solving component too!



PICKLEBALL is the fastest growing sport in North America. Coaldale Pickleball Club (CPC) has certified and background-checked (Vulnerable Sector Check) instructors and assistants who are willing to teach pickleball to students in the Coaldale area.

CPC's mission is to promote the sport of pickleball to people of all ages. To promote and encourage youth to take up the sport, CPC will be running a youth program for students ages 12 to 17 on Friday afternoons from 1:00 to 2:00 pm and a second session from 2:00 to 3:00 pm if required. Registration is limited to 12 students per session. The Program will start on January 6, 2023 and continue through to March 31, 2023 at the Coaldale Mennonite Church Gymnasium.

The program will include instruction and game play. There is no charge for this program; however, for insurance purposes, CPC requires that all participants become members of Pickleball Canada/Alberta/Coaldale Pickleball Club. This is an online registration process pickleballcanada.org with online payment of \$25. The membership is good until December 31, 2023 and allows access to the organized group play at the outdoor courts at Eastview Park.

Paddles and balls will be provided. Please have court shoes or running shoes with non-marking soles.
