
RECESS EXPECTATIONS

When you are finished booking, click Done. You will have a summary of your interview schedule in your mailbox.



We will be continuing SWAP until the end of March. This is a great opportunity for students to work in different groups on improving literacy skills.



GRADE 6 POD

MATH - MACKLIN

March will see us beginning Unit #4: Patterns and Expressions. Students will also be doing daily work with operations of whole numbers. I encourage all students to practice their basic multiplication, division, addition and subtraction facts at home on a daily basis to improve their speed and mastery of those skills. We will be moving through this next unit at a steady pace so it is vital that students are checking Google Classroom if they are absent, or seeing their teacher for help at recess or after school if they need extra instruction to understand a concept.

<u>SOCIAL STUDIES - CONRAD</u>

We just wrapped up our unit on "How Provincial Government Works." Up to this point in the year we have focused on how democracy works in Canada. For the next couple of months, we will take a look at democracy in different parts of the world. In March, we will spend some time studying Ancient Athens, commonly known to be the "birthplace of democracy." I am really looking forward to this part of the year; I am confident that students will enjoy the change as well. After Ancient Athens, the last major topic to be covered is the Iroquois Confederacy.



Mrs. Netzel - continue to work on etymology and morphology word work. We are discovering the origins of many of our common English words, and discovering their connections to Latin, Greek, French and Indigenous languages. We are also learning about the structure of words, especially the prefixes, roots, and suffixes. We are getting closer to finishing Refugee – it is getting intense. A reminder for students to be reading at home, preferably 20min/night, and they should ALWAYS have a book for class.

Miss Johnston - We are continuing into the final stages of the Tell Your Story unit. By the end of this month students will have written an opinion paragraph and a short story. We have explored a multitude of short story elements and storytelling techniques over the past few months and it is very exciting to bring all of the hard work that the students have accomplished together. March marks the halfway point of my practicum here at Baker. I am very proud of the work that students have done so far and I am excited to see what we still have to come. A reminder that if students are missing class or feeling confused with any of the classwork that they are welcome to come see me at recesses to get one-on-one help.



SCIENCE - MACKLIN

In March we will be starting our fourth Unit, Flight. This unit shares many common ideas and principles with Air & Aerodynamics (Unit #3 wrapped up in early March). We will continue looking at the properties of air, as well as the four forces of flight, and specific names of parts of airplanes and what their functions are, and a comparison between human made flying devices to flying animals and insects. There will be many demonstrations, experiments and hands-on projects in this unit, making it one of the favorite Science units for many Grade 6 students.

GRADE 7 POD



MATH-MRS.SMART

In March, there will be a midterm to start the month covering the first four units of the year. Then, we'll be working through our fifth unit on Variables and Equations. We will use the skills we learned in evaluating expressions to help us as we begin to explore modelling and solving linear equations.

Students will be exploring the different forms of poetry, what makes up a poem and discovering where poetry started and how it has developed over time. end of the month, hopefully before Easter break. We're really excited to end the month with a cross

SOCIAL STUDIES- MS.SERBU

We will be finishing up with Chapter 7 which will wrap up the first half of our curriculum in which we learned about how Canada was formed as a country. After that we will begin Chapter 8 which will lead us into Canada after Confederation with a focus on the Métis community. Materials will be made available on Google Classroom as we reach them.

GRADE 8 POD

MATH-MRS. BERRY

March has us tackling Chapter 5: Pythagorean Theorem. This is quite a hands-on chapter and one that most students genuinely enjoy. We begin by revisiting the square of a number and identifying perfect squares. Then, students are introduced to the inverse operation: square roots. We also explore the approximate square root of numbers that are not perfect squares. Next, we investigate the Pythagorean Theorem. Students will both develop and apply this to solve problems involving right triangles. Following the completion of Chapter 5 will be Chapter 6: Measuring Prisms & Cylinders.

SOCIAL STUDIES-MR. SMITH

We are concluding our study of the Aztec unit this month and the students will get to practice looking at multiple perspectives and how both people in an argument can feel they are right. The curriculum will study what took place when the Spanish and the Aztecs met for the first time.



LANGUAGE ARTS-MR. WILLEMS

We are working on our film study of <u>Spider-man: Into</u> <u>the Spider-verse</u>, a movie about perseverance and finding the hero within. We studied cinematography, the effects of angles and lighting, and picked out the countless examples of literary devices present throughout the movie. Next up, we will be looking at Artificial Intelligence and its affects on our world, from the lens of argumentative essays.

SCIENCE-MR. GINTHER

Welcome back! Students are going to finish their Mix & Flow of matter unit then we are going to have a lot of fun exploring our mechanical systems unit in March. Students will gain an understanding of simple machines and the principle behind hydraulic systems. There are quite a few hands-on projects coming up in this unit so it should be a nice way to wrap up the colder months!

We've officially wrapped up Basketball season and are moving into Badminton!


Badminton Intramurals will be starting in March! Bring your gym clothes to compete against other bear groups to earn points for your Bear Den!


