RIBMS DRESS CODE (as printed in the school agenda)

With the warm spring weather upon us, please review the RIBMS dress code with your child/children.

The primary objective at RIBMS is the academic success of all students; consequently, the dress policy allows for the conditions most conducive to learning, that students can work comfortably and without distracting or disturbing others. The key principles of the policy call for dress to be CLEAN, NEAT and MODEST.

Students dressed inappropriately will be asked by their homeroom teacher to go to their lockers and change into appropriate clothing. It is understood that students will do this quickly and that the inappropriate clothing will be covered **FOR THE DAY**. If no appropriate clothing is available, the students will be directed to the office to either call home for suitable clothing, or be provided with clean clothing at the office. If a student needs to wait for a parent to bring appropriate clothing, the student will wear what is provided at the office for the interim, in order that the student can return to the classroom as soon as possible. The student can then go to the office at the next break to change into the appropriate clothing supplied by the parent.

Specific items that will not be worn to school include:

- Slippers
- Spaghetti straps, muscle shirts, tube and halter tops
- Transparent or see-through fabrics
- Short tops that expose the midriff at ANY time
- Low cut tops
- Short shorts, skirt, or skorts (must be past standing finger length, even with tights or leggings)
- T-shirts that are in poor taste*

- Hats and headgear (bandannas, skull caps etc.)
- Jackets and coats are not to be worn in the classrooms
- Clothing that is designated underwear should be kept undercover

*The dress code policy specifically prohibits clothing that contains logos or advertisements for drugs, alcohol, or tobacco; that contains or implies messages with sexual innuendo, or that appears to promote racism, discrimination, hate or illegal activities.

The dress policy applies to all school activities – dances, field trips, PE classes and extra-curricular sports practices, etc. save school-designated theme days which will allow students to dress in theme related attire while still conforming to the dress code.



STUDENT SAFETY AND SECURITY

For the safety and security of our students, only parents or legal guardians will be able to communicate with their child or children while they are at school. Please be aware that family members who are not recognized as a parent or legal guardian cannot contact a child at the school. Permission from parents or legal guardians for other family members or friends needs to be given ahead of time to the office, before contact is permissible. If you are away and you have given the responsibility of the day to day care of your child to someone else, an administrator at the school needs to be informed. We would need to know the person's name and contact information. We continually strive to maintain a safe environment for our students and your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Also, if there is any information we need to be aware of in terms of access and custody of your child it is the parent's responsibility to provide the school with those legal documents.

TRACK & FIELD

RI Baker students participated in our very own track and field meet on Thursday May 3rd. We had an awesome day and witnessed great athleticism and sportsmanship. A huge thank you to all of our parent volunteers who assisted in running events. We could have not put on this big event without you!

We had eighty three athletes qualify for meets through our track and field meet. Grade seven and eight athletes competed at the UofL on May 10th in the County of Lethbridge Track and Field Meet. We had an amazing showing, taking home both the grade 7 and grade 8 banners. GO BEARS! A number of our athletes won aggregate awards. Golds went to Payton Lyon, Kayleigh Klima, and Rylen Roersma, silver went to Ty Young and Eve Duerksen took bronze. Grade 6-8 students competed in the LSAA City Track Meet on May 23rd. GRADE 5 POD

May was a busy month. We competed in our first Track Meet, on May 3rd, and on May 23th, we had a visit from Jeanette Smith who did a presentation on electrical safety, sponsored by Fortis Alberta, we participated in a video conference on May 29th, learning about the Leopard Frog and the grasslands.

As a follow up to our Video conference on May 29th, we will travel to Park Lake on Thursday,, June 7, for hands on activities around the lake, with an interpreter from Alberta Parks. Students need to take a substantial bag lunch, water, walking shoes (no flip-flops), sunscreen, hat and clothes for the outdoors. A list of what to bring was sent home with the permission forms.

Each classroom will need 3 to 4 parent volunteers for this field trip. Please contact your homeroom teacher.

On Tuesday, June 26, a field trip to Nicholas Sheran Pool in Lethbridge will happen in the morning. We will be eating our bag lunches in a city park before heading to the Movie Mill for the afternoon.

Permission forms were sent home for these activities. Please return them ASAP.

Wednesday, June 27th is the last day. The grade 5's will be handing out their certificates in the Gym from 2:30 – 3:30 pm. Once the certificates have been handed out, there will be a grade level powerpoint presentation.

Language Arts

We have wrapped up our Friend or Foe Non-Fiction unit, and have begun to delve into Literature Circles! In a small group setting, students are analyzing a text selected at their

level. Additionally, we are continuing with our study of *Mick Harte was Here* by Barbara Park, and our Word Study using the Words Their Way program.

Social

As we approach the end of the year, we are entering our final unit in Social Studies! Here, we will compare and contrast the Cordillera and Interior Plains regions. Students will use a variety of resources to compile the information needed to compare the two regions.

Science

Science A, B, C, D and E: We are continuing to learn about the Wetlands.

Math

Math 5A , B, C, E. Hard to believe we are coming to the end of the year. We will wrap up Math this year with Addition and Subtraction of Decimals, probability and geometry.

GRADE 6 POD

Language Arts

June's focus is on building and practicing reading comprehension skills through daily multi-genre reading comprehension practice, and literature circles. The students will also be engaging in a short creative writing unit, which will also help expose them to a variety of genres, while allowing them choice in the writing process. Part B of the LA PAT (reading comprehension) is on June 19th. Exam bank will be an excellent resource in preparing for this.

Social

In Social, we will be wrapping up our Iroquois unit and touching briefly on the Grande Paix de Montreal. Once all our units are finished we will be reviewing information from all year in preparation of the Social PAT on June 18. Use Kahoots and ExamBank as great review tools in this time.

Science

In Science, we will be focusing on evidence and investigation. Be prepared for your child to come home with investigative knowledge and application! Our science PAT is on June 22 so please encourage your child to review their notes and access ExamBank to get ready for the test.

Math

As June begins, we will do our final unit on Probability, as well as some quick activities about sorting polygons, classifying triangles, and identifying congruent shapes. We will then review all of the concepts from Grade 6 Math in preparation for our Math PAT on June 20.

GRADE 7 POD

Thank you to all our parent volunteers for coming on the Zoo trip this month. We could not do this trip without you!

Language Arts

We are wrapping up the year with our poetry unit. We will focus on poetic vocabulary, how and why we read/write poetry, and we will try writing some poems ourselves. This vocab will be on the final exam, as well as some poetry analysis. There will not be a final project for this unit as we are just learning and trying it out for ourselves.

Social

We are finishing the year by looking at the Metis peoples, the National Policy and how the west was settled. Students will be writing their combined chapter 9/10 test the second week of June and will then begin studying for their final exam. The written part of the final will be completed during regular class time, whereas, the multiple choice section will be completed on June 21st in the gymnasium. The final exam will be based on material from chapters 6-10 in our textbook.

Science

Our final unit, Structures and Forces, will be completed by the middle of June. Students will have a chance to build their own structures and test them to explore the importance of structural stability, margin of safety, modes of failure, joints and material strengths. The science 7 final exam will consist of only the last three units - Planet Earth, Heat and Temperature, and Structures and Forces, and reviewing for this can begin at any time! Vocabulary booklets are an excellent resource and place to start this review.

Math

We will be completing the eighth and final unit of the year. The two sections include geometric constructions and Cartesian plane plotting and transformations. A few of the concepts we will be exploring are: perpendicular and parallel line segments, perpendicular

and angle bisectors, plotting points using ordered pairs, as well as translations rotations and reflections of points on a Cartesian plane.

The final exam will cover the final four units of the year, which include solving algebraic equations, circles and area, data analysis and probability, and the final unit of geometry. Review for this can begin at any time!

GRADE 8 POD

Language Arts

We have finished up our novel study, moving in to the next unit which is poetry! Students will work with figurative language to enhance their vocabulary and writing abilities. This unit will be full of creative and interesting projects and assignments that will make the students think deeply about text.

Social

Our Japan unit is in full swing. Students are currently learning about the Edo Period in which the Shogun controlled Japan. When complete, we will be heading into the Meiji unit where the United States meets Japan and starts making economic and cultural changes. We will also leave time at the end of the year to study for our final exam.

Science

We will be finishing up our final unit of Fresh and Saltwater Systems. We will deepen our understanding of where the water is on our planet and our, and other organisms, dependence on it and how we can be good stewards of this valuable resource. During this month we will be taking time each week to go back and review some of our earlier units so that we aren't leaving all the review for the final exam to the last minute! The science 8 final will be covering all 5 units: Mix and Flow of Matter, Cells and Systems, Light and Optics, Mechanical Systems and Fresh and Saltwater Systems.

Math

We will be completing Chapter 7: Data & Probability at the beginning of the month. Next, we will begin work on Chapter 8: Geometry. This is a project-based chapter and we will focus on tessellations. Finally, we will take the remainder of our class time to focus on the Final Exam. With that said, I would like to take this time to remind everyone that the final is a cumulative exam covering all 8 chapters. Review at home is highly recommended and can begin at any time!

Keep Your Teen Smiling

It takes 17 muscles and two rows of teeth for your teen to smile. A smile means everything and is proven to increase confidence and enhance quality of life. So take good care of that smile.

Here are some tips to keep your teen smiling for life:

Brush with fluoride toothpaste. Brushing with fluoride toothpaste two times a day is an effective way to protect teeth from tooth decay. Remember that brushing before going to bed is the most important time because saliva decreases, which increases the chance for tooth decay.

Drink water with fluoride. Drinking tap water with fluoride is the best drink to quench your thirst. Not only does water help wash away food and debris in your mouth, the fluoride

strengthens your teeth and protects them from tooth decay.

Limit sweet snacks and drinks. Sweetened snacks and drinks can cause tooth decay. Be especially aware of drinks with sugar, like pop, sports drinks, specialty coffees, iced tea and slushy frozen drinks.

Avoid injury to your teeth. Mouth guards, seatbelts and face shields can help protect teeth. Mouth piercings, using teeth to open items, and chewing on hard objects can cause injury and should be avoided.

Visit a dentist. Ask your dentist about treatments to keep your teeth healthy.

First, Second and Third-hand Smoke

Skin cancer is largely preventable, with about 82% of melanomas linked to factors we can change. Exposure to ultraviolet radiation (UVR) is the main cause of skin cancer but other harmful effects include sunburn, premature skin aging, and eye damage. Choose sun-safety strategies that work: a broad spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher, use shade, clothing, a hat with a wide brim, and sunglasses. First, Second and Third-hand Smoke

There are 7,000 chemicals in tobacco smoke, 69 of which we know cause cancer. There is no safe level of exposure to tobacco smoke. Tobacco smoke is either:

First-hand: this is what the smoker blows out.

Second-hand: this is what the smoker blows out or what is released from the end of a burning cigarette.

Third-hand: this is the harmful residue and gases left on surfaces (such as on furniture, in carpet and clothing) after a cigarette has been smoked.

In children, second-hand smoke increases the chance of respiratory infections (like chest colds) and ear infections. Children with asthma will likely have more serious attacks more often.

Smoking in the home or in the car affects everyone in the family, including pets. The best way to protect your family from



being exposed to second- and third-hand smoke is to make your home and car tobacco free.

Work together as a family to make a plan:

- Talk about the good things about a tobacco-free home and car.
- Give everyone a chance to speak.
- Plan for guests who may want to smoke.
- Set up an area outside away from doors and windows in case someone wants to smoke.

- Remove all ashtrays from inside your home and clean the one in your car.
- Have signs to welcome guests to your smoke-free home and vehicle.

Celebrate your success as a family. It may take some time for everyone to adjust—there may be small setbacks. Always keep in mind that people who smoke are addicted to nicotine, which can make changes, such as smoking outside, hard to do.
