Counsellors Corner

STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO GET PICTURES/VIDEOS OFF THE INTERNET

Many youth take pictures/videos of themselves and send them to friends or post the content online — you are likely no different. Sometimes, the content may end up on the Internet without your permission. When this happens, removing the picture/video is often a primary focus.

If you know where your picture/video has been posted, you can try to take steps to get it off the Internet. The most popular websites and other online services have a process for reporting and many place a higher priority on situations involving children/youth. If you have been impacted by a sexual picture/video being posted on the Internet, there are some practical steps you can take to regain some control over the content. By including certain information in your report, there is a good chance these sites will take down the sexual picture/video of you.

STEPS YOU CAN TAKE:

1. Determine what service (e.g. YouTube®, Facebook®, Twitter®) the picture/video is displayed on and contact that service to request that they remove the picture/video.

For information about contacting popular websites and requesting the removal of pictures/videos, please visit needhelpnow.ca/contacting_popular_sites.

Be sure to get directly to the point as the service likely receives a large number of complaints each day and it will be helpful for them to know why your request is important.

At a minimum, include the following information within your complaint:

a. Your age: This lets the website/online service know that you are a child/youth. If the picture/video was taken when you were a different age than you are presently, include your age at the time the picture/video was taken as well as your current age.

b. Identify yourself as the person in the picture/video: Say that you are the child/youth in the picture/video. If you are identifiable in the picture/video (i.e. if a person who knows you viewed the picture/video, s/he would recognize you), include this as well — the website/online service may give your complaint a higher priority.

c. Object to the posting of the content: Say that you did not post the picture/video to their site, did not give permission for the content to be posted and that you want it removed. This lets them know that you object to the continued posting of the picture/video.

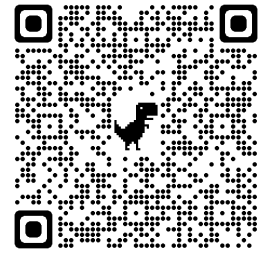
You may also want to include information in your complaint about who had access to the content. If you sent the picture/video to someone else, say so, and give the name of the person you sent the content to. This may help the website trace who posted the content and prevent the individual from posting content in the future.

The above information is for general use only. It is not intended, and should not be relied upon, as legal or professional advice.

2. You may want to submit a report to Cybertip.ca. If you are being threatened, intimidated or blackmailed in any way, we highly encourage you to talk to a safe adult about what is occurring. Parents can contact the RCMP for support regarding this as well. For more information on situations that have gone too far, please see needhelpnow.ca/reporting.

GRADE 5 POD



Language Arts: We've wrapped up our unit on Complete Sentences, and students demonstrated their learning through our "My Amazing Life" writing assignment. We will be moving on to the study of the novel *The Bad Beginning* by Lemony Snicket that will focus on utilizing various reading strategies.

Social: We are completing our Mapping skills unit, including longitude, latitude and scale and are beginning our adventure of touring across Canada, starting with the Atlantic region.

Science: We are just finishing Wetlands and will be starting our Electricity unit. We will look at electrical safety, ways we can measure and control electricity, and apply techniques for evaluating magnetic and electrical properties of materials.

Math: We have wrapped up our introductory unit of Numeration and will be studying Multiplication. We will look at strategies for mental math multiplication, multiplication arrays and 2 digit by 2 digit multiplication. I encourage students to work on memorizing their times table.

GRADE 6 POD

Language Arts - We have been working on finishing up our "This is Me" project, as well as focusing on some specific word work learning. Students have been enjoying the class read-aloud, *Refugee*, by Alan Gratz. The classes have also been engaging in journal writing using various prompts. We have had the pleasure of having students share some of their creative writing with the class. We just got started on our "Elements of a Short Story" concepts and will continue learning these concepts this month, while applying them to various short stories we will read in November/December.

Social - We have essentially completed our first 2 chapters in social studies. Through these chapters, students have learned an overall picture of what democracy is, and how to get involved in our community. We also took an in-depth look at the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. In November, we will be shifting our focus to look at the different levels of government, beginning with the municipal, or local, government.

Science - We wrapped up our Evidence & Investigation Unit at the end of October and are beginning many students' favourite Unit - Sky Science! Grade 6s often have a lot of background knowledge in this unit such as the order of planets from the sun, and other planetary information. We'll be learning about moon phases, and other celestial objects such as meteors, comets and asteroids in this unit as well. Please check Google Classroom for what we are covering in class if absent or for review.

Math - As we start November, we will be wrapping up Unit 1: Understanding Number, by reviewing our Place Value, Order of Operations and Factors & Multiples mini units. Once this unit is complete, we will begin Unit 2: Decimals. This unit will look more closely at Decimal Place Value & Decimal Operations. Please check with your child if they are running low on pencils, and that they have headphones as well as a basic calculator at school for checking their work once complete.

GRADE 7 POD

Language Arts -We are continuing to work through our narrative writing unit, we completed a quiz on the concepts covered. We are now moving into our narrative writing skills in the form of a superhero comic book! Students will develop their own superhero characters, plotlines and conflicts before creating their own comic strips online. Ideally, we will begin our first novel study by the end of November; *The Giver* by Lois Lowry. Once we have finished the book in December we will watch the film adaptation and compare the stories.

Social - We are just finishing up learning about the French coming to North America and the beginning of the fur trade. Once we wrap up this chapter we will begin learning about the British and how they came to North America and the impact that they had on the First Nations as well as the French who had begun setting up colonies.

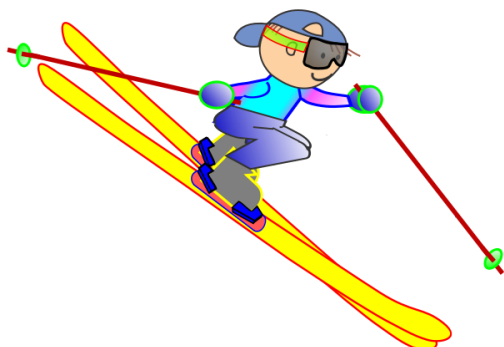
Science - Once the Interactions & Ecosystems unit test has been completed in early November, students will be starting to explore the Plants for Food and Fibre unit. We will be taking a closer look at the different parts of plants as well as their uses and environment. There will be a flower dissection lab as well for some hands-on learning!

Math - As we start November, we will be completing our current unit on Fractions, Decimals and Percent, and then moving on to our next unit about Fraction Operations. In this unit, we will explore adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers with like and unlike denominators. Some students are coming to class without their scientific calculators, so please ensure that your child has a calculator here at school.

GRADE 8 POD

Language Arts: We have been wrapping up our “Mystery, Mayhem, and Suspense Unit”-- focusing on literary devices, foreshadow, and character development--and moving on to our “Say Something Unit”. This unit is all about the powerful message/theme a picture book can portray using only a few words and a handful of pictures. The end result will be the students’ own original book. We are also continuing on with our daily routines of silent reading, writing prompts, short films, online portfolios, and grammar work.

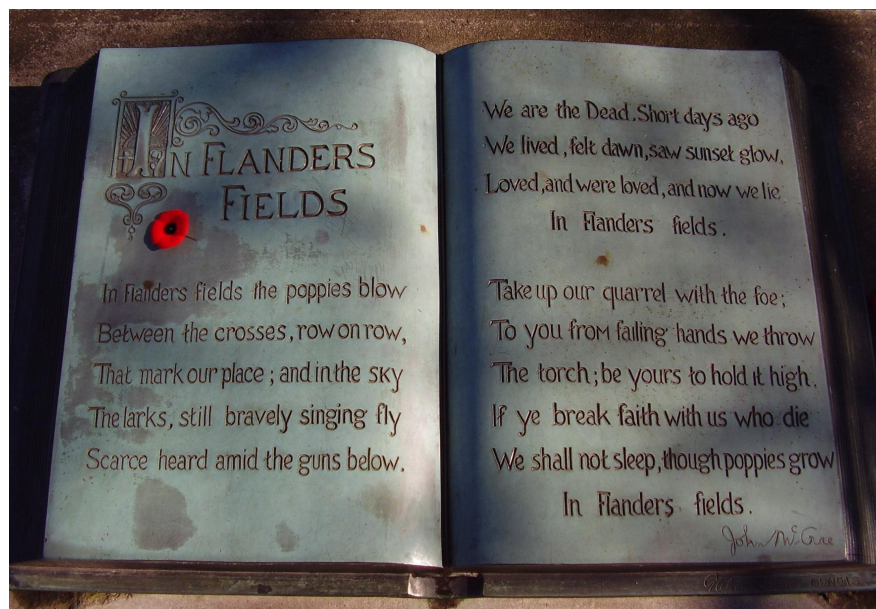


Social: After exploring the different factors that led to the Renaissance and exploring a variety of sources from the past, the students debated the relationship between the Renaissance's beginning and the exchange of ideas. I was impressed by the arguments and questions asked by the students. We are now moving into developing a historical perspective and imagining what it would be like to be living in an Italian city-state during the Renaissance. We will be looking at their economy, government, and the influence of humanism.

Science: Students will wrap up the Body Systems unit and start on Fresh and Salt Water Systems..Earth is sometimes described as the water planet. Over two-thirds of Earth’s surface is covered by oceans and freshwater features. By exploring examples of aquatic systems, students come to appreciate the dynamic nature of these systems and learn about the interaction of landforms, sediments, water and climate. Students also investigate factors that affect the distribution of health of living things in aquatic environments and the supply and quality of water for human use.

Math: This month, we will be finishing up Chapter 2: Percent, Ratio & Rate. Students will demonstrate an understanding of ratio and rate. Students will solve problems that involve rates, ratios and proportional reasoning. Finally, students will work with percentages (greater to and less than 100%). Then, we will head into Chapter 3: Integers. This year, students will learn to both multiply and divide integers. We will review addition and subtraction of integers and eventually solve problems with multiple operations involving integers (Order of Operations = BEDMAS). This will take us into the month of December.
