
> We would like to share a few EDSBY tid-bits of information that we have learned that may be helpful to parents.

Edsby invitations have been issued to all parents that we have an email address in our system for. If you did not receive one, please contact our office so we can resend the invitation and/or investigate why you did not get it.

Entering Absences in Edsby:

When entering an absence through Edsby, you have 2 options. If you select "Absent Today" your options are to choose the absent reason, and enter a comment (optional). The absent times will be automatically set to "Beginning of Day" to "End of Day."

If you select "Plan an Absence" you get also get the option to select a date (or range of days) as well as specific times, or periods. You may select the current date – it does not need to be a date in the future. You may select a time from the drop-down list or type in a specific time.




**TIP: : DOWNLOADING THE EDSBY APP AND ALLOWING NOTIFICATIONS FROM EDSBY HELPS US NOTIFY YOU QUICKLY IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT!



We have come across an issue in Edsby, where notifications are set up differently for students with siblings. If you have more than one student in Palliser schools this may be affecting you. Here is how to change the notification settings in Edsby, if you are not getting notifications (attendance, grades, etc.) for all of your students. In this example, Sibling 1 is the older sibling and they were added to Edsby first .:

1. From the main

screen, open the menu on the top left of the screen

4. In the Notifications window, you can see which notifications are set up for each school, as well as each student.

If you click "Reset All to Default" it will turn ALL notifications ON (in each individual student, and each school.)

It was fantastic meeting so many families during interviews this month!

This month we began our literacy intervention groups also known as "SWAP." This means, for one period a day, Monday through Thursday, all grade 5 students are developing literacy skills appropriate to their level. We are so excited with how this is going so far and are already seeing growth! This will continue for the month of December and then we will take a break in January.

In December we will also be going on a field trip! On December 21st we will head to Coaldale Sportsplex for the afternoon. Students must provide their own skates and helmets (no bike helmets allowed!) There are no rentals available. GRADE 6 POD

MATH - MACKLIN

We are working on our Decimals Unit in the month of December. We are adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals, as well as solving problems related to decimals; such as money math. As well as decimal operations, we'll be integrating decimals into our previously learned place value knowledge. Practice those math facts nightly and check Google Classroom for review or if a student is absent!

<u>SOCIAL STUDIES - CONRAD</u>

We have finished learning about what democracy looks like in practice,

and have begun to learn about the government at the local level. We will be learning about how decisions are made at this level, and why.

LANGUAGE ARTS - NETZEL

It is hard to believe it is already December! This month, we are continuing to work on our reading and comprehension of short stories. We will be also be writing a reflective paragraph closer to the end of December or the beginning of January. In between our short story studies, students will be doing mini lessons on capitalization, punctuation, quotation marks, etc... with our PSI student, Miss Ford, from the UofL. Lastly, students are reminded to come to class with their independent reading books, in addition to their binders, and pencil cases (including pencils), for every LA class. There are still numerous students coming to class unprepared.

SCIENCE - MACKLIN

We have started the Sky Science unit in science class. We will be studying objects that emit and reflect light in space, characteristics of different stars and planets, and what constellations are and how they move in our sky. This is a great time to get outdoors with your child and take a look at the night sky since it is dark early! I have been adding helpful links since November and will be posting other celestial events on Google Classroom regularly, so be sure to check this daily, or especially if absent.

GRADE 7 POD

MATH-MRS.SMART

In December, we'll continue working through our second unit - Fraction Operations. Students will be adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers with like and unlike denominators. We will try to wrap this up before Christmas. There are many students who still come to class without a scientific calculator and pencil every day. Please check in with your child to see if this is them! It makes it difficult to learn when you do not have the proper supplies.

SOCIAL STUDIES- MS.SERBU

We are finishing up with learning about the impacts of the fur trade and we will then be moving on to learning about some of the battles that took place in Canada and the impact that they had on the development of our country. All materials and assignments will be made available to you on Google Classroom as we cover them in class.

LANGUAGE ARTS- MRS. HUFF

This month we will be continuing to work through our novel study using the core text The Giver by Lois Lowry. Students are exploring the elements of dystopian fiction and working toward answering the inquiry questions of: How does this novel reflect our modern world? And Is safety more important than freedom? At the end of the unit we will watch the film adaptation of The Giver (2014) and compare the two texts and analyze the changes made. We will learn and practice argumentative writing throughout the unit and end with a mock trial of one of the story's characters. This unit will flow into January.

SCIENCE- MRS. SMART

Now that our first unit is behind us, we are into the second - Heat & Temperature. We are exploring the differences between heat, temperature and thermal energy through a variety of activities. This will continue on into the new year, where we will do review of the first two units and a midterm in late January. Stay tuned for that!

GRADE 8 POD

MATH-MRS. BERRY

We will be spending the majority of December completing Chapter 3: Integer Operations. This includes a review of addition and subtraction of integers (completed in Math 7). Then, we will introduce multiplication of integers, followed by division of integers. Then, we will look to solve order of operation problems involving integers. Lastly, as with every chapter, there will be a problem solving component too!

SOCIAL STUDIES-MR. SMITH

WWe have finished our learning about humanism and how ideas spread in a time before the internet. December will have us learning about exploration and the reasons for it. We will learn about the impacts Renaissance Europeans had on the development of the worldview that exists in the western world.

LANGUAGE ARTS-MR. WILLEMS

We have just finished our Mystery, Mayhem, and Suspense unit where we focused on foreshadow, character development, and paraphrasing. We then began our Picture Book unit where the students are learning the skills of developing rich ideas in limited space and through multiple mediums. We have continued to work on grammatical writing skills, as well as adding specific detail to our writing. Feel free to check in with your child as to what they are currently reading-- if they aren't reading a book they enjoy, let me know and we can work on finding a good fit together!

SCIENCE-MR. GINTHER

In science students will continue to work through our Fresh and Salt Water Systems unit. We are working through the unit and students and parents can find all notes and videos on google classroom to stay up to date with the class.
