













You can also remove your booking or change it to another available time.

When you are finished booking, click Done. You will have a summary of your interview schedule in your mailbox.







If the interview period has not yet been closed for editing by an administrator, parents can make changes to their interview schedule by clicking Make Changes.

MATH - MACKLIN

Welcome, Mr. Burns, our PSIII student from the University of Lethbridge! He will continue working with all three grade 6 classes, after introducing Unit #3; Fractions, Decimals, Percentages, Rates & Ratios, in January. Grade 6s will continue to learn about improper fractions, mixed numbers, and ratios. Students will learn about number lines, modeling fractions, and equivalent ratios. Students will need to have their pencils, lined papers, and crayons for this unit, so please be sure to check if your child still has these supplies or if replacements need to be purchased. Please also double check that your child still has a basic calculator, which will be needed later this year.



SOCIAL STUDIES - CONRAD

This month, students in social studies are working through the chapter on Provincial Government. Topics include an in-depth look at the services provided by the province; students research one service and give a short Google Slides presentation to the class, thus becoming an "expert" in their service, while hearing about all the other services from their peers. We will also look at the different political parties that typically run in provincial elections, the types of laws made at the provincial level, as well as the roles and responsibilities of different politicians at the provincial level, including MLAs, the Lieutenant Governor, the Premier, and Cabinet Ministers.

LANGUAGE ARTS - NETZEL

Welcome, Miss Johnston, our PSIII student from the University of Lethbridge! She will be working with all three gr. 6 classes in our ELAL classroom and taking over most of the teaching for ELAL until April 19. Mrs. Netzel will still be working with the students for ELAL for a few periods/week. We will be continuing to read short stories with a focus on comprehension practice, as well as an oral presentation and into February, writing effective paragraphs. Emphasis will be placed on proper format, detailed examples, writing, and editing skills. Mrs. Netzel will focus on The morphology and etymology of words to further enhance our word work. We will also work toward an exam of our terms, concepts, and reading comprehension skills, most likely toward the end of February. More details will be forthcoming, and there will be advanced notice for the exam. Students can continue to review their "Elements of a Short Story" notes and terms.

SCIENCE - MACKLIN

We will continue to learn about concepts from our Air & Aerodynamics unit (introduced at the end of January), as we begin the month of February. By the end of the month, we will be moving into our Flight unit, and there is a lot of overlap between these two units. We will be looking at the properties of air and how moving air impacts air pressure and flight, as well as learning about how birds, insects and aircraft can achieve flight. There will be a focus on the four forces of flight, especially the force of LIFT and how this is part of Bernoulli's Principle. These units will allow students to participate in a variety of hands-on activities and experiments. Please continue to check Google Classroom for all materials used in class, as well as slide shows, videos and other resources available for review if your child misses school.

GRADE 7 POD



MATH-MRS.SMART

Students will continue working through the fourth unit about Patterns and Relations. In this unit, students will explore and extend patterns, identify expressions and equations, describe linear relations, create and graph tables of values for linear relations, and analyze graphs to draw conclusions. Following this unit, there will be a midterm covering the first four units of the year. Stay tuned for a date for this!

LANGUAGE ARTS - MRS. HUFF This month students will complete a mini a

This month students will complete a mini unit in decoding word problems. The goal of this small unit is to help students determine the important information in any written word problem in order to answer the questions correctly. After that, we will start our unit on Poetry!

SOCIAL STUDIES - MS. SERBU

Students will be working through Chapter 6 & 7 which takes us through the War of 1812 and the effect it had on Canada as well as the Canadian Confederation. Materials will be posted on Google Classroom as we cover them.

SCIENCE- MRS. SMART

Students began the third unit, Planet Earth, in January and will be continuing this unit in February. In Science, students will be exploring and observing; rocks, minerals, the rock cycle, erosion and weathering, layers of the Earth as well as earthquakes, volcanoes, fossils and fossil fuels.

GRADE 8 POD

MATH-MRS. BERRY

Our focus for the month of February will be finishing up Chapter 4: Patterns & Relations. This chapter involves students analyzing linear relations through equations, graphs and tables of values. Next, we explore solving equations. This is an extension of Math 7 and will utilize algebra-tiles to help us understand all of the steps required to solve different equations. Also, within the month of February, the Math Midterm will take place. This will cover Chapters 1 - 4. Once this is completed, we will move into Chapter 5: Pythagorean Theorem.

LANGUAGE ARTS-MR. WILLEMS

We are just wrapping up our Picture Book unit and will begin a Word Collectors mini-unit where we are looking at the etymology of words. We will be taking this time to look at common prefixes, suffixes, and roots of words to better decipher new vocabulary. Following this will be our LA midterm, a culmination of everything we've looked at since September. February will bring a new mini-unit on Spiderman: Into the Spiderverse, where we'll be studying film techniques, character development and plot structure.

SOCIAL STUDIES-MR. SMITH

We have begun our Aztec unit and students are enjoying the content so far. Similar to the Renaissance unit, we start by studying their origin stories as well as how they chose to organize their society. The focus of the unit is to see what happens when two similar worldviews collide (Spanish and Aztecs).

SCIENCE-MR. GINTHER

In science we are continuing with our Mix & Flow of Matter unit. The materials we use- including natural and manufactured ones- often take the form of fluids. Students learn that such diverse substances as air, natural gas, water and oil are fluids. In further investigations, they discover that many common household materials are aqueous solutions or suspensions in which the main component is water. Students learn that the properties of individual fluids are important to their use, including such properties as density, buoyancy, viscosity and the fluid's response to changes in temperature and pressure. The particle model of matter is used to make a conceptual link between the nature of matter and the specific behavior of fluids.

Students will also be writing their science midterm exam prior to the reading break so watch google classroom for study material and dates.

A huge thank you to our parent volunteers for filling our Coach's Room at the home tournaments!








